BUILDING TRUST IN DATA AND STATISTICS, AND LEAVING NO ONE BEHIND

HOW IS OHCHR SUPPORTING MEMBER STATES?

The Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR) is strengthening institutional linkages and collaboration between National Human Rights Institutions (NHRIs) and National Statistical Offices (NSOs) to monitor and evaluate public policies from a human rights perspective, through the use of a model Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) as a tool for the formalization of collaborative working relationships. These MoUs seek to assist parties in sharing knowledge and expertise and in collaborating on official data collection, dissemination and analysis.



As of July 2021, OHCHR has 10 MoUs in place in the Philippines, Mongolia, Moldova, Kosovo*, Albania, Uganda, Kenya, Liberia, Mexico and Occupied Palestinian Territory.

*References to Kosovo shall be understood to be in the context of Security Council resolution 1244 (1999)
