The challenge

 Follow-up and reporting to human rights mechanisms involves a multitude of actors and a vast amount of information.

• The creation of a National Mechanism for Reporting and Follow-up offers an institutional solution to this problem...

 ...but the practical challenge of coordination and information management in day-to-day work remains.



Common practical challenges in the coordination of follow-up planning and reporting

- Processing a large number of complex recommendations and interlinked follow-up activities
- Assigning responsibility and generating ownership for impleme ntation and status tracking
- Agreeing on standard operating procedures for developing followup action plans and drafting reports
- Gathering information on the implementation status of follow-up activities to prepare reports
- Loss of institutional memory due to staff turnover




Introducing the National Recommendations Tracking Database

- A shared digital application for the members of the NMRF to manage information and facilitate coordination in a central place
- Developed, hosted and maintained by OHCHR for Member States, with customisable elements adjusted to national needs (incl. support for local languages)
- A central repository for recommendations from human rights mechanisms and related follow-up plans and activities
- Reflecting existing planning frameworks, institutional roles and responsibilities and standard operating procedures

How does the National Recommendations Tracking Database support the follow-up and reporting process?









Benefits of using the NRTD



Benefits of the National Recommendations Tracking Database

- Making the link across mechanisms, action plans and institutions
- Improved coordination across the government, breaking silos
- Documented responsibilities for follow-up and reporting
- Continuous updating of information in a central repository
- Supporting preparation of reports to international human rights and sustainable development mechanisms
- Connection to OHCHR systems to receive updates on recommendations, reporting obligations, etc.



Roll-out milestones

- A well-established National Mechanism for Reporting and Follow-up (NMRF) with a clear mandate and terms of reference
- A well-resourced NMRF Secretariat organising regular meetings of all members and coordinating the programme of work
- A comprehensive human rights action plan, recommendations implementation plan, or sectoral action plans
- Standard operating procedures and institutional roles and responsibilities for action planning, implementation tracking and reporting
