The following is our Oral Statement from April 09, 2021 at the Permanent Forum on People of African Descent - Virtual informal consultation with Member States and Civil Society.

We'd like to make the call again as it aligns with the Working Group's topic on "Intergenerational deprivation and Anti-Black Racism: Asset building for economic and financial freedom of children of African descent."

With an increased focus on Police Brutality, the inequities highlighted by COVID and a rise in Hate crimes it's time to expose all that got us here and implement ways to move forward.
