Questionnaire: Elimination of Discrimination against Leprosy Affected Persons and their family members

Response of Estonia

- Leprosy is an extremely rare disease in Estonia. There have been no identified leprosy cases during the last decade, including neither imported nor indigenous cases.
- We are aware of the existence of the Principles and guidelines for the elimination of discrimination against leprosy affected persons and their family members. However, mostly due to the leprosy epidemiological situation there has not existed practical necessity for particular actions towards elimination of discrimination against leprosy affected persons and their family members.
- There are also no exceptions in terms of constitutional and human rights for leprosy affected persons and their family members. They can enjoy all rights fully and equally with other persons in Estonia.
