Objective and link to Forum mandate:

The purpose of the Forum is to "discuss trends and challenges in the implementation of the Guiding Principles [on Business and Human Rights] and promote dialogue and cooperation on issues linked to business and human rights, including challenges faced in particular sectors, operational environments or in relation to specific rights or groups, as well as identifying good practices."

A number of governments have introduced new legislation and regulation as part of their efforts to implement the Guiding Principles at a domestic level. Major corporations are also taking steps to reinforce internal policies and processes to ensure respect for human rights, including to give increased emphasis to the use of legal tools, in particular contractual provisions, to ensure respect for human rights.

The objective of this side event is to discuss legislative and regulatory developments and the increasing trend for in-house lawyers and lawyers in private practice to be closely involved in human rights due diligence and risk management. The panel will consider the implications of the responsibility to respect human rights for the execution of business transactions and will also discuss trends in human rights litigation. Here,

the objective will be to examine whether the Guiding Principles are having an impact on the resolution of business related human rights grievances and the ways in which litigation risk may influence corporate risk management and governance.

It is hoped that the event will serve to highlight the important role corporate lawyers are playing in contributing to the effective implementation of the Guiding Principles.
