Eighth session of the United Nations Forum on Business and Human Rights, Geneva 25-27 November 2019

As a delegate of the Legal Commission for the Self-Development of Indigenous Peoples ("CAPAJ"), I must say that there are two types of societies; natural societies formed by people with memory, deeply connected to mother nature and artificial societies formed by mass culture corporations which cut through this connection. Therefore, colonialism, created by corporations, has origin and affiliation: They are called States.

Everything that the State touches poisons the body and the mind. To be guided by the rivalry between the right and left shows ignorance and keeps us trapped in its policies. The State model is in crisis, the West's social model with its structure and governments are not the benchmark for the future, these political structures sit outside of logic.

The transnational corporations have decided to wipe out natural peoples and they do so in the name of the "State", the greatest transnational on the globe, managed by the IMF and the World Bank, and their worshipping operating companies. They are biting the hand that feeds them. We have to look at the oppressing reality everyday that they carry on their backs, the weight of the power of the banks, the oil companies, the telephone companies, exporting companies, importing companies, textile companies, government ministries, the army, hydroelectric companies, revolving doors, construction companies, organisational actions, vulture funds etc. That is to say, it's always the same war against the oppressed, proof of this, Sebastian Piñera, by fire and sword against the people of Chile. Accompanied by an army that won the battles against his own people.

The transnational lady is obese and bloated in the name of progress, but life doesn't agree. The state puts her next to the men. The people have never got to power because the people are oppressed by the power. People cannot be defined. Therefore, creating transnational corporations is typical of a colonialist state. All of the men are the same man.

The burning of the Amazon in Bolivia and Brazil was not an accident; in the first two million hectares in the Chiquitania forest there was an "ecological and premeditated human disaster". A decree to allow "controlled fires" that "extend agricultural borders". And the "right hand" in Brazil with its Protestantism machine that keeps Bolsonaro in power, supporter of the agribusiness 'hooked on meat', which is based on soy bean cultivation and livestock farming, the main causes of the global climate crisis and responsible for two thirds of the total deforestation in South America. They are the private property of the transnational companies, the USA, the West, the cog in the big machine.

After China, the EU is the second largest importer of soya in the world and makes up 87% of the grain used for animal feed. The excessive consumption of meat and dairy products contributes to deforestation. The advisers, the food chains, McDonald's, Burger King, KFC, bigger bellies, less freedom;

From our continuity of collective memory, despite enduring more than 5 centuries of colonisation, we can respond to this historical situation and its global threat. Shown by the brothers and sisters of Ecuador, breaking the barrier of fear, fighting with the force of old tigers, without confusing rebellion with resistance, and paving the way for the political independence of the state, from the unity of the world view, the concept of time, logic, symbolism, spirituality, resisting yesterday, with a "no" in their mouths. In this light the indigenous revolution has emerged, returning to what you started.

Only then will they discover that you cannot eat money".
