In paragraph ten of the above-mentioned resolution, the Council requested the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights to consult Member States and other relevant stakeholders in order to prepare and submit to its forty-fourth session an analytical study on the promotion and the protection of the rights of persons with disabilities in the context of climate change. For environmental considerations, electronic submissions are encouraged and we ask that responses not exceed five pages. Please submit contributions in MS Word or compatible format in either of the official working languages of the United Nations (French or English). Inputs received will be posted on our website.

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Questionnaire in relation to Human Rights Council Resolution A/HRC/RES/41/21 on human rights and climate change

- 1. Please <u>describe the impacts</u> of the adverse effects of climate change on the full and effective enjoyment of the human rights of persons with disabilities. Where possible, please share specific examples and stories.
- 2. Please describe any relevant <u>commitments</u>, <u>legislation</u>, <u>policies</u> and <u>other measures</u> that you have taken, in compliance with applicable international human rights law, in particular the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, to promote an approach to climate change mitigation and adaptation that ensures the full and effective enjoyment of the human rights of persons with disabilities. Please also note and identify <u>any relevant mechanisms</u> for ensuring accountability for these commitments including their means of implementation.
- 3. Please share a summary of any <u>relevant data</u> that captures how the adverse effects of climate change have affected persons with disabilities, taking into account multiple and intersecting forms of discrimination (i.e. discrimination based on a combination of multiple grounds, including disability, gender, race, colour, sex, language, religion, nationality and migration status).
- Please <u>describe mechanisms and tools</u> that can be used to measure and monitor the impacts
 of climate change on the full and effective enjoyment of the human rights of persons with
 disabilities.
- 5. Please <u>identify and share examples of good practices and challenges</u> in the promotion, protection, and fulfilment of the human rights of persons with disabilities in the context of the adverse effects of climate change. Please include examples that highlight multilateral cooperation and approaches that are implemented in close consultation with and with the active Involvement of persons with disabilities, including children with disabilities, through their representative organizations.
- 6. Please provide <u>any additional information</u> you believe would be useful to support climate action that promotes the full and effective enjoyment of the rights of persons with disabilities.
