## **Constitutional Court of South Africa:**

ECOWAS Community Court of Justice (2010):

Nigerian NGO Socio-Economic Rights and Accountability Project (SERAP) vs. Nigerian Government:

Nigerians' right to education had been breached under the

African Charter on Human Rights and Peoples' Rights by massive grand corruption in the public education budget.

Grand corruption ⇔ violation of HR recovery of \$ 21,5 million

The negative impact of corruption on the enjoyment of human rights

Stresses that preventive measures are one of the most effective means of countering corruption and of avoiding its negative impact on the enjoyment of human rights, calls for the strengthening of prevention measures at all levels, and underlines that one key aspect of preventive measures is to address the needs of groups in vulnerable situations who may be the first victims of corruption;

Recognizes that the negative impact of corruption on human rights and sustainable development can be combated through anti-corruption education, and notes with appreciation the capacity-building activities and specialized curricula developed by relevant institutions, such as the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime and the International Anti-Corruption Academy.
