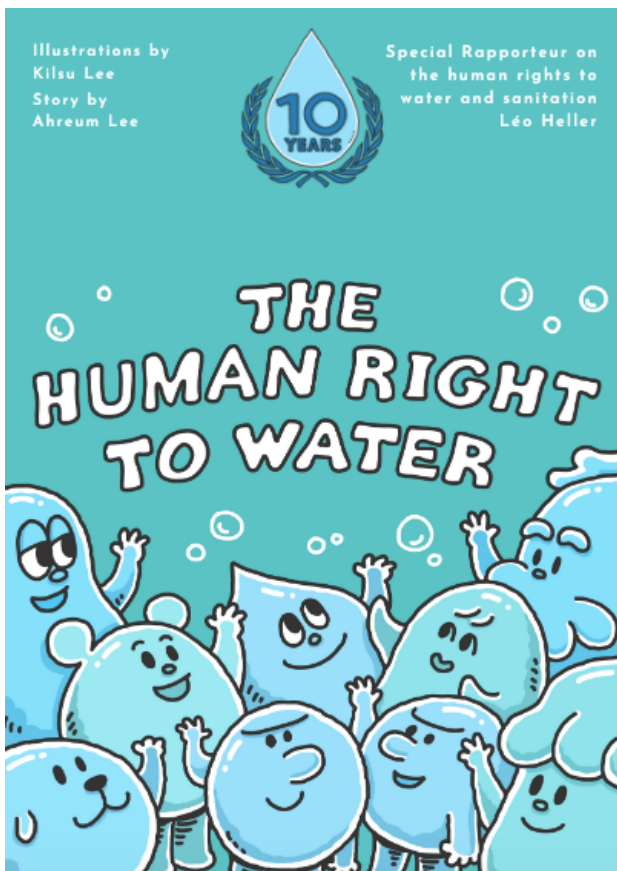

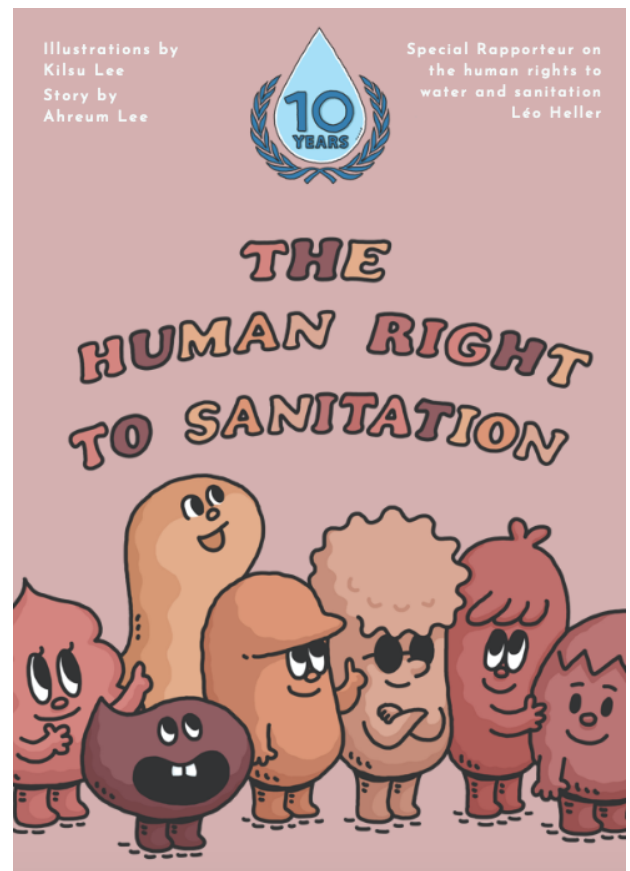
BACKGROUND

In 2020, the human rights to water and sanitation are officially 10 years old. In 2010, the UN recognized water and sanitation as a human right and after, in 2015, the UN recognized that water and sanitation are two separate but very closely linked rights.

To celebrate the 10th birthday of the human rights to water and sanitation, the Special Rapporteur released two children's storybooks, also available as coloring books.
