

- 5. How could have the links between the mandate of the Special Rapporteur and the **SDG6** been further strengthened?
- 6. How could have the links between the mandate of the Special Rapporteur and **other Special Procedures** been further strengthened?
- 7. How could have the links between the mandate of the Special Rapporteur and the **CESCR/UPR and other human rights monitoring mechanisms** been further strengthened?
- 8. How could have the links between the mandate of the Special Rapporteur and **other mechanisms** (such as UNICEF/WHO JMP, HLPF, among others) or themes been further strengthened?


## OFFICIAL COUNTRY VISITS CONDUCTED BY THE SPECIAL RAPPORTEUR, 2015-2020

During the course of his mandate, the Special Rapporteur conducted 9 country visits. Two country visits were cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Special Rapporteur also sought to enhance the effectiveness of his country visits by undertaking follow-up analyses focused on the implementation of recommendations elaborated in the reports on his 7 first official country visits.
















Percentage of cases mentioning vulnerable groups in relation to the human rights to water and sanitation
