2015

The human right to safe drinking water and the human right to sanitation are referred to as separate rights by the United Nations General Assembly

2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development is adopted, including SDG 6 on ensuring the availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all



2018

The Special Rapporteur launches the first initiative to follow-up official country visits

2019

The Special Rapporteur is mandated to organise a year-long campaign to celebrate the **10-year anniversary** of the recognition of the human rights to water and sanitation and to raise awareness of the rights

2020

The Special Rapporteur releases monthly materials to promote the human rights to water and sanitation, and to celebrate the work of the mandate
