- What are the gaps and challenges that prevent refugees, migrants and other groups to fully enjoy their rights to water and sanitation in situation of humanitarian crises?
- What elements are critical to realizing the human rights to water and sanitation in situations of humanitarian crises, particularly for refugees and migrants?
- What specific approaches related to the human rights to water and sanitation are required in humanitarian assistance compared to the realization of these rights in general?
- To what extent are obligations and responsibilities of State and non-State actors (e.g., recipient countries, UN agencies, NGOs, others) in this field conflicting or complimentary?
- How can this thematic report be used for the human rights constituents in Geneva, New York and other areas? And particularly, how can the report be used in your work?
