The main areas of UN DESA's <u>work</u> include:

Intergovernmental Support:

By facilitating major global conferences and summits in the economic, social and environmental fields, as mandated by UN Member States, UN DESA assists countries as they find common ground, set norms, and take decisive steps to move the world forward.



Analysis:

As the think tank of the United Nations, UN DESA, generates, analyses and compiles a wide range of economic, social and environmental data and statistics to inform and advise Member States and other stakeholders as they take stock of trends and policy options to tackle common problems.

Capacity Building:

UN DESA aids in translating policy frameworks developed in UN conferences and summits into programmes at the country level and, through technical assistance, supports Member States in building national capacites.




WATER DECADE (2018-2028)



UN DESA is leading the support to UN Member States in the implementation of the Water Decade (2018-2028) mandated by GA resolution 71/222 in 2017. The related Action Plan aims to advance sustainable development, energize existing programmes and projects, and inspire action to achieve the 2030 Agenda towards meeting water-related challenges. The next important milestone is the <u>UN Conference on the</u> Water Action Decade in March 2023.

BACKGROUND OF WATER DECADE

- In **December 2016** the United Nations General Assembly unanimously adopted the resolution "<u>International Decade for Action Water for Sustainable Development" (2018–2028)</u> in support of the achievement of SDG 6 and other water-related targets.
- On **20 December 2018** the General Assembly adopted the resolution on the "Midterm comprehensive review of the implementation of the International Decade for Action, 'Water for Sustainable Development' 2018-2028". (A/RES/73/226).
- On **21 December 2020**, the UN General Assembly adopted resolution <u>A/RES/75/212</u> "United Nations Conference on the Midterm Comprehensive Review of the Implementation of the Objectives of the International Decade for Action, "Water for Sustainable Development", 2018–2028", outlining modalities of the Conference.
