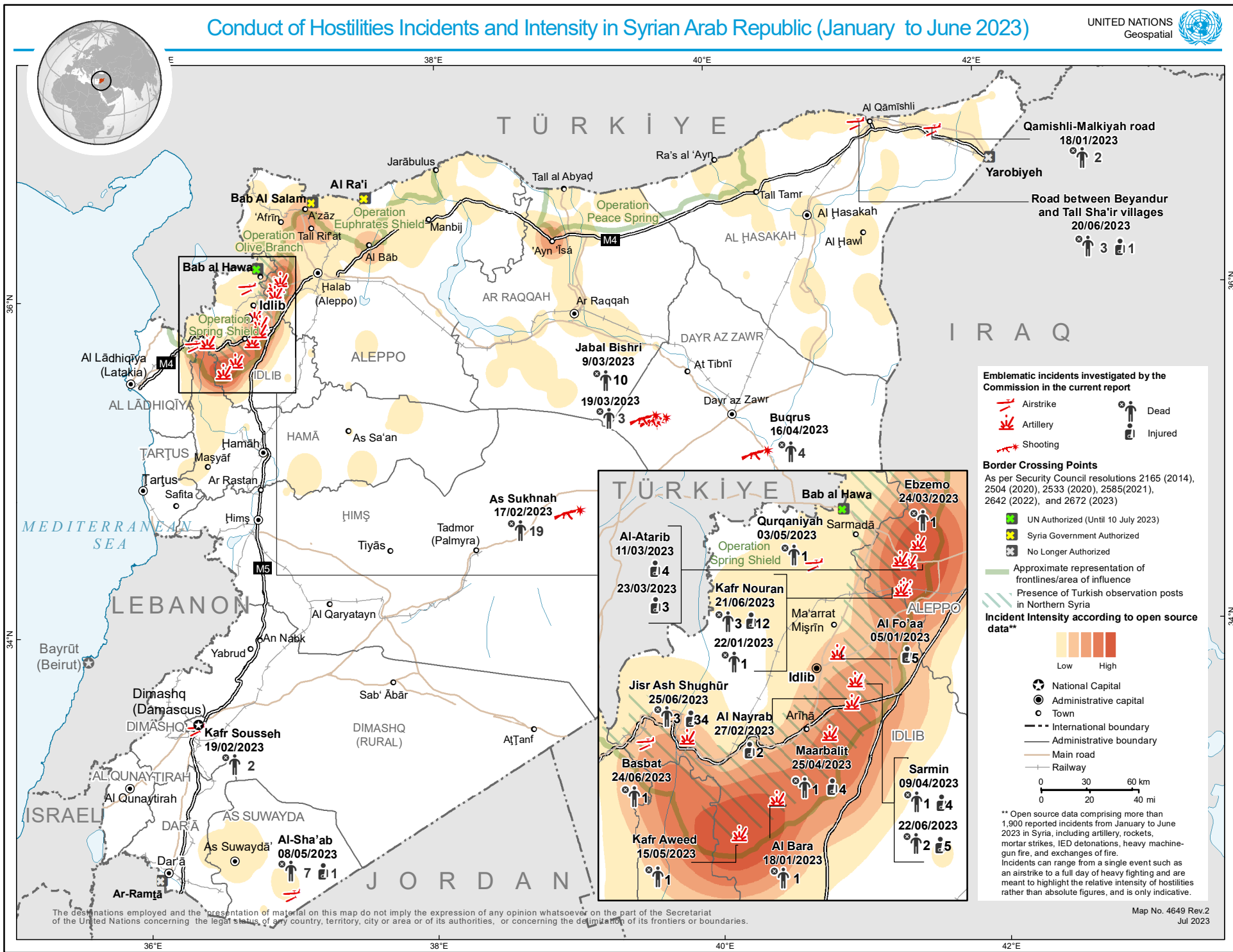


Conduct of Hostilities Incidents and Intensity in Syrian Arab Republic (January to June 2023)

** Open source data comprising more than 1,900 reported incidents from January to June 2023 in Syria, including artillery, rockets, mortar strikes, IED detonations, heavy machine-gun fire, and exchanges of fire. Incidents can range from a single event such as an airstrike to a full day of heavy fighting and are meant to highlight the relative intensity of hostilities rather than absolute figures, and is only indicative.
