Mandate

The Voluntary Fund for Financial and Technical Assistance in the Implementation of the Universal Periodic Review was established in 2007 by Human Rights Council resolution 6/17 and further strengthened by resolutions 16/21 and 51/30.

The fund provides financial and technical assistance to support countries, in particular least developed countries and small island developing States, to implement recommendations emanating from the universal periodic review in consultation with, and with the consent of, the country concerned.

A **Board of Trustees**, appointed by the Secretary General and composed of human rights experts from all regions, provides advice and guidance on policy orientation and strategy in the operationalization of the Fund.

"We will work to strengthen the relevance, precision and impact of the Council's recommendations, including by providing better support to Member States in implementation, stronger collaboration with United Nations country teams and the establishment of national mechanisms for human rights reporting and follow-up to link the universal periodic review to the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals."


Facts & Figures

The Voluntary Fund provides seed funding aimed at enhancing national capacities in one or more of its established focus areas, creating synergies between the **implementation of key universal periodic review recommendations**, the **strengthening of Governments' institutional capacity** to ensure a comprehensive follow up and reporting on the progresses achieved, the **enhancement of the role of Parliaments**, and the strengthening of the United Nations country teams to support national efforts to implement human rights mechanisms recommendations and integrate them with initiatives to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).


Since its establishment, the Voluntary Fund has disbursed over **USD 7,000,000**, providing support to activities in **86** countries and allowing the organization of **8** regional workshops to promote the sharing of good practices.

As a result of the enhanced focus on implementation of recommendations since the third UPR cycle, the fund has progressively increased annual funding of projects.

Facts & Figures

Accepted universal periodic review recommendations have proven to be an **important entry point for creating nationally led and nationally owned processes** to implement the recommendations made by all international human rights mechanisms and integrate them with the efforts to achieve the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs. Such recommendations can also highlight areas in which early action is needed to address risks of human rights violations, therefore contributing to the United Nations agenda on prevention.

The <u>good practices</u> collected by OHCHR and other United Nations entities show that the universal periodic review has advanced the promotion and protection of human rights – in line with the Secretary General's <u>Call to Action for Human</u>

<u>Rights</u> and the resulting <u>UPR Practical Guidance</u> - and secured greater compliance, in law and in practice, with international human rights norms and with the commitments made by States in all regions of the world.


Since its establishment, the Fund has received contributions for a total amount of **USD 8,136,465** from the following countries:

While requests for support have increased during the last years, contributions have decreased in the period of 2019 to 2022.
